Snow Removal

- As snow falls make sure the snow you remove from your property is NOT placed on the street.
 Please keep it on your own property. If any snow is thrown on the street after it has been cleared, staff will not circle back to clear it.
- We ask that you make sure all power cords, and all other debris or obstructions be removed from the street. The Village is not responsible for damage done to anything that is buried and not visible beneath the snow on the street during removal.
- Please note that angle parking is permitted on Main Street only. All other streets allow parallel parking, one vehicle deep.
- Our snow removal process is to pile all the snow into the middle of each street, and then haul it away. Please be patient, we promise we will get to your street.

If you see snow removal equipment in operation, please give the staff plenty of room. If you are too close to the equipment, they may not see you or your vehicle and might not be able to stop in time before an accident happens.




