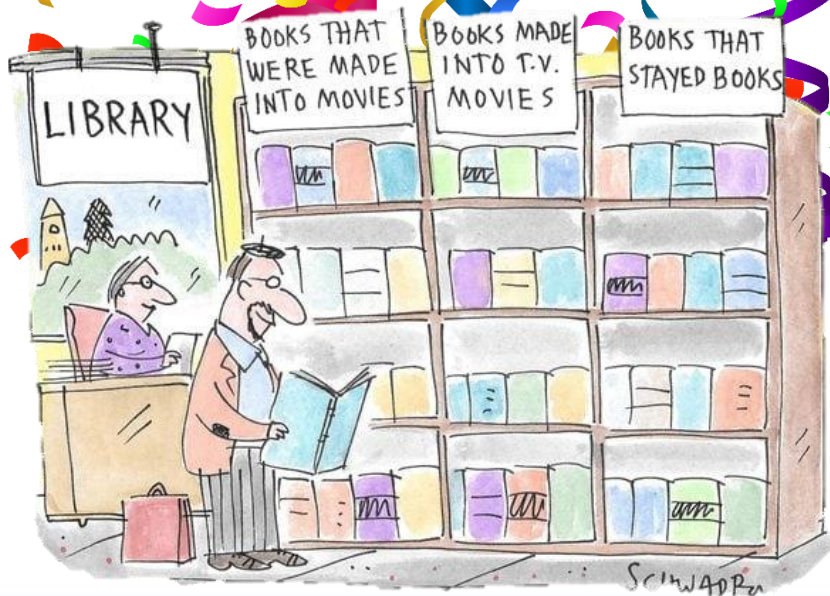


Village of Lipton January 2025 Newsletter

Canadians say “sorry” so much that a law was passed in 2009 declaring that an apology can’t be used as evidence of admission to guilt.

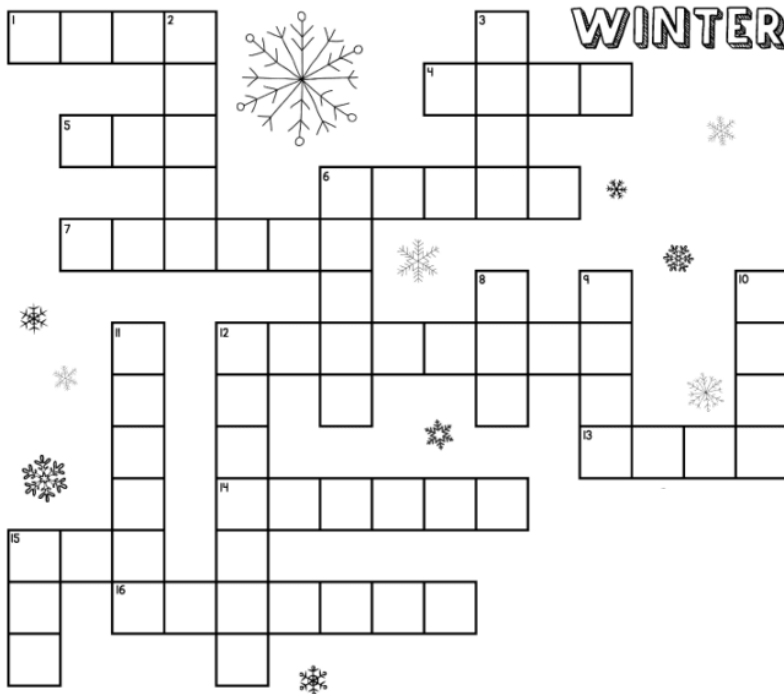
The only letters that don’t appear on the periodic table are “J” and “Q.”
